## A Toolbox for Implementing Pharmacy Services intended for pharmacists and education


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- > Implementing sustainable professional pharmacy services is a complex process.
- > Implementers need a structured approach for strategy, planning, managing and monitoring all process long.
- The *Toolbox for Implementing Pharmacy Services* (TIPS) has been developed by trainers who teach implementation of pharmacy services as part of a post-graduate education course.

➤ Each tool has been developed and/or selected to meet the objective of the implementation phases\* and generic enough to be adaptable for various types of services and pharmacy characteristics.



- > The last tool of TIPS is the formalization of a *network* to encourage peer exchanges which cuts across all phases of the implementation process.
- > TIPS can be useful as a training and practical tool when implementing services for an independent pharmacy, a pharmacy group/chain, a professional association or researchers.
- The next steps are:
  - i. validation of TIPS by a group of experts (pharmacists, managers, academics);
  - ii. finding the right format to make the tool accessible and promote the use of data collected in daily practice by pharmacists to create real-world evidence in the context of *health technology* assessment in primary care.
