 - Before vs After
- A plurality of socialization patterns?
 - Are changes group specific?
 - E.g. passive vs active members? Low cognitive resources?



Why these questions?

- Socialization effect on committed individuals
 - Social movement literature (e.g. Guigni 2004,2008)
 - Literature on Volunteerism (e.g. Wilson 2012)

- A lack of research over time
 - Many study before commitment
 - Few studies after (durable vs during commitment)
 - Even less studies which look at before and after

- Spread of (un-)democratic cultures throughout society
 - Socialization effects society at large and the quality of democracy

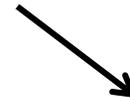

Commitment communities?

- A network of collective actors sharing
 - Relational structures
 - Interests
 - Cognitive world made of particular meanings, stories and identities (Diani 2015; Tilly 2005; White 1992)

- Three types of (left-wing) commitment communities
 - Unionists
 - Green contenders
 - Volunteers



(Un-)Democratic cultures?

- Shared meanings within a commitment community
 - Common good
 - Commonness: Beneficiaries of the common goods
 - Goodness: Social justice vs care
 - Concernedness: Range of concern
 - Politics
 - State actors: Accountability and legitimization
 - Civil society actors: Role and legitimization
 - Concernedness: Watchdog and participative



Measuring “Democratic Cultures”

- Commonness
 - General trust in people
 - Two items on gender equality
- Concernedness: Range of concern
 - Equal changes for foreigners
 - Environmental protection or economic growth
 - Opinion on nuclear energy
 - Opinion on taxes on high income
- Politics: State actors
 - Overall satisfaction with democracy
 - Trust in Federal Government
 - Opinion on social expenses
- Politics: Concernedness
 - Interest in politics
 - Intention to boycott, strike and demonstration



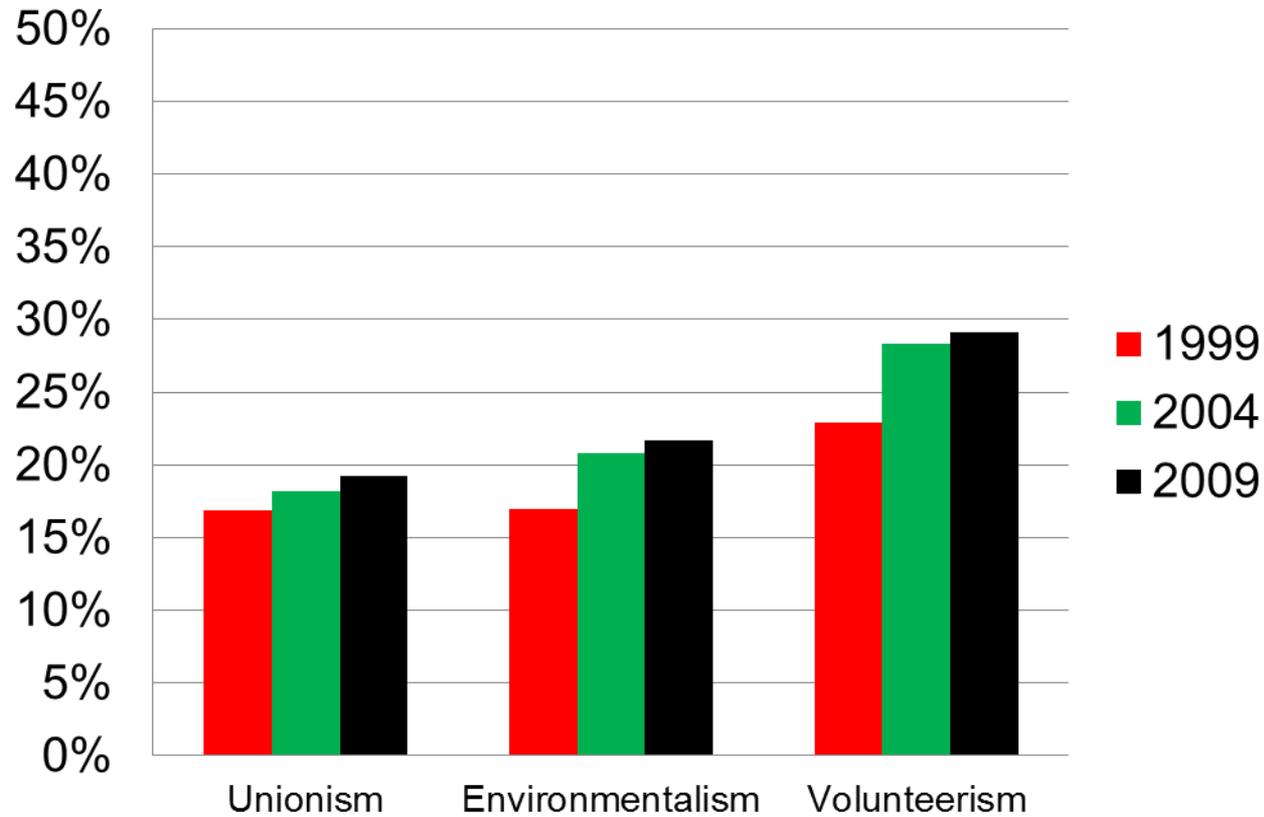
Methods and Data

- Swiss Household Panel
 - Representative sample of people living in Switzerland
 - Same persons and households every year
 - Age between 18 and 83
 - Timeframe: 1999 to 2009
 - 1999: Starting date of the panel
 - 2009: Last year membership questions were asked annually
 - However, only starters in 2003, 2004 and 2005
 - To control the same group over time
 - Always 4 years before and after individuals became member

HOW DO PEOPLE COMMIT?

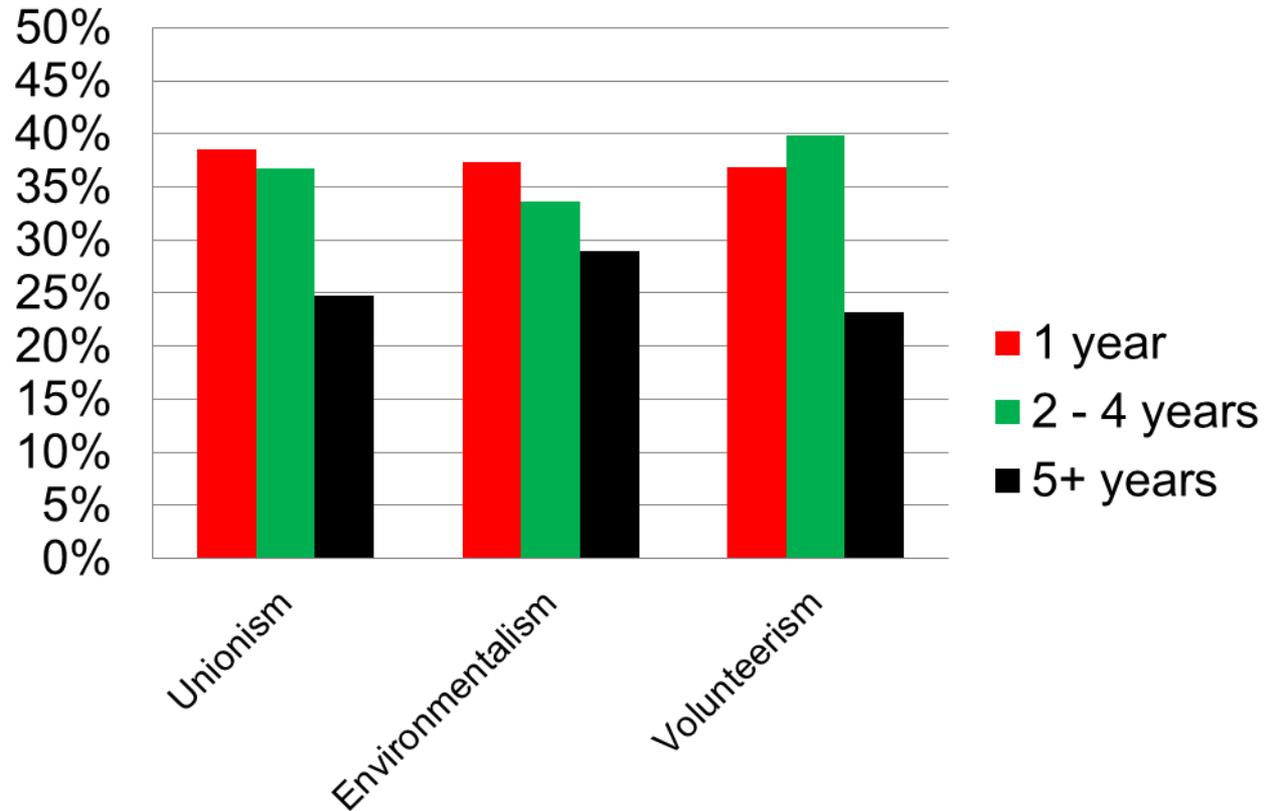


How many people do participate?





How long do they participate?





Cross- or Mono-commitment?

- 0 out of 3 communities: 34 %
- 1 out of 3 communities: 33 %
- 2 out of 3 communities: 24 %
 - Unionism and Environmentalism: 3%
 - Unionism and Volunteerism: 6%
 - Volunteerism and Environmentalism: 15%
- 3 out of 3 communities: 9 %

Does Commitment Change Their Mind?

- Members vs. Non-members?
 - Yes: Sustainers very different from non-members
- Commitment communities
 - Unionists differ from Green contenders on common good dimension
 - Volunteers differ from Green contenders on politics dimension
- Before vs. After
 - No systematic differences for starters
 - Most new members join with cognitive resources



A Plurality of socialization processes?

- Yes
 - Strong changes for those with low cognitive resource

- However, no differences
 - Between passive and active members
 - For younger generations

- Who are those with low cognitive resources?
 - Network related?
